Event to be held at the beginning of RTU Open 2024, the biggest chess festival in the Baltics.

After the conclusion of the 100 vs 100 matches, there will be a traditional RTU Open Opening Blitz Tournament. The preliminary schedule is as follows:

Prize fund: minimum 1200.00 EUR

All players are invited to participate in this tournament. However, arranging buses after the tournament ends would result in players getting home late at night, so this option is not considered the best.

Transportation

Technicalities

- Participation, of course, will be free of charge.
- A dedicated landing page <u>100vs100.info</u> will be developed, providing information about the event and an option to apply for team composition.
- Each federation should appoint at least one responsible individual. This individual will receive applications from players of their respective federation.
- If there is a large number of participants, players not included in the federation's team can participate as part of the FIDE team.
- The offer **IS NOT TO HAVE** dedicated boards for specific groups such as women, juniors, seniors, etc. However, each federation can decide on this. The criteria for selecting team players are also at each federation's discretion.
- EE Estonia and LT Lithuania can each nominate two arbiters for this event. The LV Latvian Chess Federation will cover the arbiters' salaries.
